### Guidelines for Visiting Musicians

#### About Greyfriars Kirk

Built on the site of a pre-Reformation Franciscan monastery, this iconic building offers much to see and appreciate, from reading the words of the National Covenant, signed here in 1638, right through to contemporary additions such as the magnificent pipe organ that dominates the sanctuary. Today Greyfriars is home to an active worshipping community of the Church of Scotland, with weekly services at different times. In addition, concerts, social events, exhibitions, group visits and other educational activities take place here.

#### Greyfriars at 12 Thursday Lunchtime Concert Series

We welcome applications from choral and instrumental ensembles to perform secular as well as sacred music as part of our lunchtime concert series. We offer the opportunity to perform in a beautiful space with a wonderful acoustic.

Admission to the Kirk and lunchtime concerts is free. Concerts are generally well attended with regular audiences of 30-60.

#### Concert Details

Concerts can be arranged for most Thursdays up to six months in advance\*. Some Thursdays may not be available due to other events occurring in the Kirk. Setup and rehearsal time in the Kirk is available on the day of the concert between 10:00-11:30 only.

Concerts are formally announced and begin at 12:00 midday, usually lasting no more than 45 minutes.

We will set up a basic performance space to suit your requirements, which should be completed on the Concert Booking Form. Please note that owing to other events programmed during the same period, the Kirk may be partially set up for another event at the same time.

*\*Bookings will be provisional and may be cancelled due to another short-notice requirement. However, the date will be confirmed three months prior to the performance.*

#### Performers Administrative Charge

All UK-based students in education may perform free of charge—subject to availability. For groups of six performers and over based in the UK, £10 per performer will be charged to cover Kirk administration and preparation costs. ## Greyfriars' Facilities

We can setup seating for approximately 30 singers. Additional seating can be provided for larger choirs. We can accommodate instrumental groups of up to six performers, soloists and small ensembles.

*Please note:*

- We do not have designated changing rooms or storage space for performers.
- The Yamaha C6X grand piano is available.
- The Peter Collins Organ is available for use during lunchtime concerts\*
- Onsite parking is available for one or two cars only. Coaches may drop off performers on nearby George IV Bridge. Designated coach parking is available on Regent Road and Johnston Terrace.

*\*Subject to organist's experience / music qualifications.*
